

The Music of Burns Alford

Wills and Estates in North Carolina

As AAFA Wills and Estates Project Officer, I will begin in North Carolina, the state in which I live, where the records are most convenient to me, where our 1990 Annual Meeting will be held, and where the ancestors of many AAFA members lived, at least for a time. Virtually all of the material I will seek and copy in connection with this project is filed at the North Carolina State Archives in Raleigh.

The complete text of all known pre-1900 NC Alford wills will be transcribed and reprinted verbatim in future issues of this newsletter. A xerox copy of the actual document will be filed in the AAFA Library. These NC wills are conveniently listed on page 13 of Thornton W. Mitchell's NORTH CAROLINA WILLS: A TESTATOR INDEX, 1665–1900, Volume I (Raleigh, NC: N. pub., 1987):

Most of these wills exist in two versions: (1) the actual documen, signed or marked by the Alford testator and with the signatures of the witnesses; and (2) a recorded version as it appears in a county will book. Obviously the original document is to be preferred over the text as copied into a will book, if it is available. Since the will books are readily available on microfilm, researchers often use the recorded

wills. Most original wills are kept at the NC State Archives in Raleigh. There are a few instances where only the recorded copy of an Alford will survives. The original wills of Lockhard Alford, circa 1844, and Jacob Alford, circa 1794, are lost; these are to be found only in their recorded versions, in county will books. The 1792 Lodwick Alford will is found only in a loose copy, but it is apparently a clerk's copy. The Medicus Alford will is a nuncupative (oral) will, dictated to witnesses by a dying soldier during the Mexican War.

Estates Records

In NC research, this term generally refers to the loose papers filed with the county records which were created during the process of settling estates. Some of our ancestors died testate (leaving a will), but most died intestate (without a will). Since the estates papers are a gold mine of genealogical information, those of us with NC forebears are fortunate that so many of these were saved and are available to us today.

A file of estates papers, labeled by the decedent's name and the year in which the papers were generated, might include such items as personal property inventories, administrators' accounts, itemized bills, lists of debtors, division of land among the heirs, allotments of a year's provisions to the widow, and petitions. These estates papers not only provide valuable genealogical information, especially the petitions and divisions in which heirs are specifically named, but they also often give insight into the decedent's economic status, habits, and character. A retail merchant's bill for quantities of whiskey bought at frequent intervals betrays a tippler. A doctor's itemized statement may show that the deceased died after a long illness. An inventory which lists silver, fine furniture, clocks, and "looking glasses" among the household goods obviously denotes wealth. The names of the "principal buyers" at an estate sale are usually the deceased's own kin and close neighbors.

In addition to the loose documents, records of estates are also found in various bound and sometimes indexed volumes kept by the clerks of the county courts. These often duplicate the items to be found in the loose papers. These papers, filed alphabetically by name within each county's records, are much more accessible.

A county-by-county search for Alford estate papers will be undertaken at the NC Archives. Future issues of AAFA ACTION will include summaries and abstracts of each Alford estate file in NC. As in the case of Alford wills, xerox copies of these documents will be deposited with the AAFA Librarian.

The Martha Morgan Alford Letter

The following letter was sent to AAFA by Mildred Dulaney of Mart, TX. She is a descendant of the recipients of the letter, written by Martha E. (Morgan) Alford, wife of James Alford, to Martha's brother. AAFA Member #174. Lee T. Alford of Bogalusa, LA. is a descendant of James and Martha through their son, Zachary T. Alford. Miss Dulaney wrote to us after reading an article about AAFA's 1989 Annual Meeting in her local paper that specifically mentioned Zachary. Until receiving this information, Lee Alford could not extend his lineage past Zachary. However, since AAFA records listed the lineage of Zachary's father, James, Lee now knows that he is a descendant of the James Alford who was born in New Kent County, VA, in 1687! (The December 1989 issue of AAFA ACTION details this successful extension of Lee's Alford line in the article "Success Strikes Again!")

The original letter (Ms. Dulaney kindly sent a photostatic copy as well as a typed transcription) has many spelling eccentricities and errors, all of which the editor of AAFA ACTION changed to current usage in order to make reading it easier. Punctuation was also added, but wording and grammar were kept as in the original. The original transcriber added the following note:

"The date on the letter was first read as 1862 but further study indicates it probably is 1868, both from appearance and from the fact that Francis C. Morgan came to Texas in 1867 and the writer refers to the fact that they are the only two members of the family in the state. The entire letter was difficult to read and there was not a punctuation mark in it. A few periods and commas were supplied in copying. Not even capital letters indicated the new sentences. I and every C were the only capitals."

The transcriber also added a list of "Persons Mentioned in Letter," to which AAFA data has been added here:

The text of the letter:

June 21, 1868 Titus Co., Texas

My dear brother and sister,

I seat myself this morning to answer your kind letter I received a few days ago. It had a long trip to Arkansas and then back to Texas, but I no [?] news of any importance to write you. I reckon you will be a little surprised to learn that we are in Texas, but it is so. We are here certain. If you don't believe it, come and see for yourself. We moved here last January. We started to Grason [possibly Cason, a small town in present-day Morris Co., near the southeast comer of Titus Co.] but I was taken sick and we stopped here on

White Oak Creek, 12 miles of Mount Pleasant. [White Oak Bayou appears on a present-day map of Texas about 12 miles north of Mount Pleasant, today the largest town in Titus Co., about 10,000 population.]

Rasmus did not come with us. He is living in Arkansas. I don't know whether he will move here or not. He will be out here this fall to see us. Ras has a nice lady for his wife. I think a great deal of her but I like this country better than I did Arkansas. We have a beautiful crop of corn and our cotton looks well. It is young. We tend bottomland and it was too wet to plant early. Jim says he will make a bale to the acre.

I was surprised to hear of your moving west. Mr. Alford went to Marshel [probably Marshall, about 70 miles southeast from where the Alford's were living] in February and Martin told him you had passed through there. I would have wrote to you long before this I had have known where you was. He said you spoke of going to Bell Co. [Texas].

I don't know whether Mr. Alford will buy land here or not. We live on a rented place this year. I want us to get somewhere close together next fall. Mr. Alford says he wants to settle close to you. He says he thinks we might as neither of us has bought land yet and we are all that is in Texas. I would love so well to live close to you and Ann where our children could visit and where I could visit you and Ann for I have got so no count I can't go far. 1 am getting tolerable old but I do not use specks yet but I feel right old sometimes but I can milk yet. Mary does the most of it.

But I will finish my letter as I did not finish it the 21. It is now the 25. No news only Mr. Alford is quite sick this

week. He had 2 chills and I am afraid he has got the fever. He is some little better this evening. He has suffered a great deal this year. He had a spell of rheumatism in the spring. Then he had a spell of cramp colic that he did not get over in 6 weeks. He has nearly lost his health anyway. It grieves him a great deal.

We have had a heap of bad luck since we have been here. We lost the last horse we had, one died and 1 run away. So it left us with one mule. We met up with a friend that let us have as many as we wanted to plow. If it had not been for him I don't know what we would have done.

But write to us what land is worth there and how you like that country, what stock is worth, how you come to this country, by land or water, and who of Ann's sisters lives cloe to her and where Nancy is. I heard that she come to Texas. Tell what become of every thing at Pa's, if they ever have had any sale, how Ma is making out, in fact tell mc all you know. Is Gus married? I can't hear one word from there. I wrote some 5 or 6 letters back there. I wrote a letter to Ma about 2 weeks ago. I don't know whether any of them will answer it or not.

Mr. Alford is better this morning though he is very feeble. The balance of the family is all well. Ann if you have not got beans and Irish potatoes, send over. I know there could be 2 meal sacks full gathered this morning. We have thousand of vegetables of all kinds. Send if you have not got plenty. Ann I can beat Ma a smoking. Do you smoke, Dink? I think you treat your old aunt badly or you would write to me, Dink. Mary says you must right to her. She will write to you in a few days. She docs all the cooking, her and Fan. Tell the children all to write. Ann write me word how many children you have. My baby is name Julius. He is a captain. He will be 5 years old next October.

But did you know that my poor Toby was dead? He died last April was I year ago. His fits killed him. He suffered a great deal before he died. I hated to give him up though he is better off. He was perfectly willing to go. He prayed to die. Poor Toby he is in heaven with his kin I believe. I have 3 children there with their old grandpa Bud and sister. We have many ups and downs in this world. We are all well this morning. Look over bad writing for I can't see too well. I will come to a close. Write often, I am always proud to hear from you all. Write soon.

M.E. Alford to her brother and sister F. Morgan [and] Ann

When the Morgans moved to Texas in the late 1860's, William Claudius "Claude" Alford, born in 1850 to Francis and Ann Morgan, wrote many letters to his friend back in Alabama, Henry Johnson. Mildred Dulaney also sent transcribed copies of three of these letters that mentioned Zachary Alford, Claude's first cousin.

From a letter written 8 July 1869:

"I heard from Zack not long since. He was well & all of their family. He in Titus County, Texas. Lone Star is his post office. That in Eastern Texas. Cousin Margie, Zack's sister, married in April the Mr. Page. They say she done well & I am in hopes she has."

From a letter written 28 March 1870 from Waco,TX:

"Cousin Jim Alford is living with us now. His mother died in January with pneumonia. When he left home his sister was down with it but was getting over it. He hasn't heard from them since he left. Zack turn out badly but nothing else was expected of him. He went to the field to pick cotton one morning & left the field. Never heard of him since. Jim says he never was

satisfied after he went home. He had to go to work which never did agree with Zack. I hope he may reform but think it doubtful."

From a letter written 11 Sept 1874 from Mount Calm, TX:

"Zack Alford was married on the 21st of June to a Miss Thorton. He beat himself bad. She is a nice lady aged 16 but I don't see what she can promise herself for just what anyone is when a boy that is what they will be when men. He hasn't got a cent to save his life and not much of anything else."

New Member Lineages

Listed below in large bold print are the names of our new members. The numbers preceding the names are their AAFA Member #'s and an individual code shown between the member number and the member name. This code is extremely useful to Gil Alford because all his files, computer and otherwise, are keyed to it. Numbers printed before the names of the ancestors are the numbers on the members' pedigree charts.

Following the member's name is the "family branch code," a code in parentheses that identifies the new member's major family branch—if we have "established" one. If we have not established a family branch for that member's Alford ancestors, then the parentheses contain two question marks.

If you can add information or make corrections, please do so. You can submit the information on plain paper or you can request a blank Alford Family Worksheet from AAFA. All additions and corrections will be published in this newsletter. We hope all members find this listing useful in determining whether they share ancestors with other members.

NOTE (repeated from last quarter for the benefit of all our new members): Lodwick Alford, born about 1710 in Virginia, is included in many members' lines that follow. Much is still to be learned about Lodwick. The family tradition that he died 1789 in Georgia is becoming weaker all the time, and so far not a shred of evidence has been found to support it. The Lodwick who wrote his will in 1792 did die about 1800. but it is not known if this was the same one who was born in 1710. Exactly which Lodwick was the father of several of those listed in the lineages is still not known.

Wives Susanna Hartley and Rebecca Ferrell have been listed. It is proven that Lodwick married a Susanna, but the Hartley has not been proven. Strong family tradition says he married a Rebecca Ferrell, but no proof to this claim has been found.

The first four new members were listed in previous issues without data.

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Part Six of J. Alford's Alford Family Notes

From Josiah Alford's 1908 Alford Family Notes, this chapter continued from the previous issue: THE ALFORDS OF SUSSEX, LONDON, AND HERTFORDSHIRE

Edward Alford, the third son of Robert Alford and Ann Brydges, was afterwards of Aston-sub-Edge, in the county of Gloucester. This further connection with the West of England no doubt resulted from his mother being a member of the Brydges family already mentioned.

In 1580 Edward Alford was engaged in a law-suit, in which his brother Francis also had a part, concerning the manor of Aston-sub-Edge.

The State Papers for 1584 contain a deed of confirmation by Francis Alford to Edward Alford of the manor of Aston-under-Edge, in trust, for the sole use of the said Edward Alford. The manor was described as containing: "12 messuages, 10 cottages, a dove-house, 12 gardens, 12 orchards, 24 acres of meadow-land, 200 of pasture, 10 of wood." Edward Alford married, and had a son, Launcelot Alford, who apparently died young.

Launcelot Alford, the fourth son of Robert Alford (i) and Ann Brydges, was described later as of York House, Twickenham, Surrey. In 1548 he was appointed "Clerk of the Hanaper" in Dublin, There is mention of him in 1560 as still holding this office. In 1573 the superior post known as the "Tellership" became vacant, "a very lucrative sinecure office" in the gift of the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and Roger Alford (his brother) wrote to Lord Burghley, then Lord Treasurer, whose secretary he was, asking him to obtain the appointment for Launcelot. (See letter, AAFA ACTION, December 1989, page 23, column 3.) The applicaction was successful, and he held the office for

some years.

In 1582 Launcelot Alford obtained a twenty-one year lease of that well-known estate called "Yorke House" at Twickenham in the county of Surrey. "An historic mansion, one of the most beautiful old seats on the banks of the Thames, built of red brick, with high-pitched roof, in the 16th century. It stands in well-timbered grounds of about 10 acres. It was the residence of James II while Duke of York, and his daughters, afterwards Queen Mary and Queen Anne, were born in the house." Here he lived after his retirement from official life in Ireland.

Launcelot Alford married Anne Underwoods, and had two children:

- "Basyll Alford, sonne and heire" of whom no further record is found.
- Francys, who married Richard Wright of Stoke, Nottinghamshire.

We now return to the family of Roger Alford (2) and Elizabeth Ramsay:

3. Edward Alford (senior), of London, and afterwards of Offington, county Sussex, Esquire, was the only surviving son of Roger Alford of London and Hitcham. He was born in 1565, and his matriculation at Trinity College, Oxford, is recorded in 1581, at the age of 16. In accordance with the instructions of his father's will (see letter, AAFA ACTION, December 1989, page 24, column 2), he studied for the law and entered at Lincoln's Inn.

The British Museum Add. MSS (12,503) contain a letter from Edward Alford dated 1593, to Sir Julius Caesar. His autograph is appended:



Edward Alford entered Parliament in 1603, and pursued a somewhat notable political career, as the following notices testify: "1 James I, 1603. New House of Commons. Member of Colchester: Edward Alford, Esq." A similar entry appears in the record for 18 James I, 1620.

The following notes are taken from Parliamentary History, March 16, 1620. "Proceedings relative to the Grievances." "Mr. Alford holdeth it a preposterous thing to be called as witnesses in a business where we have before been Judges"—Vol. i, 1207.

Nov. 27, 1621. "Mr Alford saith that since the Powder Treason the Papists say there hath been no practice against the King; and he wisheth that now, on our loose with Spain, those who are about the King should look well that he be not endangered."—Vol i, 1312.

In Gardiner's *History of England* we find some references to Edward Alford, thus:

General Index, p. 228: "Edward Alford applauds Coke's attack on the monopolies: asks (1621) for freedom of speech. Is made Sheriff (1625) to prevent his appearance in Parliament."

"Great was the joy in the House. 'This,' said Alford, an old Member who had represented Colchester ever since the death of Elizabeth—'this is the first Parliament that ever I saw Councillors of State have such care for the State.'"—Vol. iv, p. 41 1626.

"Charles, appealling to the people for a free gift, purified the Commission of the Peace by the dismissal of those persons who were likely to oppose the measure. Elliot and Phellps, Seymour and Alford, ceased to bear the honours of Justice of the Peace in their respective Counties."—Vol. vi, p. 125.

Mr. Edward Alford continued to represent Colchester in Parliament for two more years, and then sat for Steyning, Sussex in 1628, but was at this time, and doubtless to a great extent in consequence of the above events, that he retired to the mansion and estate of Offington, in the parish of Broadwater, Sussex, near the modern town of Worthing. The family had an ancient connection with that County. but this manor had been bought by the Alfords from the West family (now represented by Earl De la Warr), in the reign of Queen Elizabeth, and remained in the Alford family until 1726.

"Offington House, formerly the seat of the Lords De la Warr, is on the northwest side of the parish of Broadwater, surrounded by a small park containing venerable trees. What was its extent formerly may be seen by the following enumeration of its apartments:

My Lord's bedchamber
The gallery chamber,
The inner gallery, with
The closet next the garden,
The gallery at my Lord's chamberdoor,
The genteel women's chamber

door,
The genteel women's chamber,
My Lady's chamber,
The great chamber,
The middle chamber,
The hall, the chapel,
The black parlor,
The tower chamber,
The noercerye,
The chamber over the butterye,
The parlor of the seller," etc., etc.

Gardiner's History of England proves the continuance of Edward Alford's political career.

1628. "The discussion in Committee was opened by an appeal from Alford to the lawyers present to inform him what benefits would accrue by the confirmation of the Statutes without explanation."—Vol. vi, p. 272.

From Guizot's *History of the English* Revolution of 1640, p. 26, we find some further information as to his career in parliament:

May 8th, 1628. "The House drew up the famous Bill 'The Petition of Rights,' adopted it, and transmitted it to the Upper House for its assent." The King objected, "addressing advice upon advice to the Peers, to the Commons message upon message." "The perplexity of the Peers was great," but "the Bill was adopted with this addition: 'We humbly present this petition to your Majesty, not only with care of preserving our own liberties, but with due regard to leave entire that Sovereign Power wherewith your Majesty is trusted for the protection, safety, and happiness of your people." May 17. "When the Bill thus amended came back to the Commons: 'Let us look into the Records' said Mr. Alford, 'and see what they are: what is Sovereign Power? Bodin saith that it is free from any conditions. By this we shall acknowledge a regal, as well as a legal, power. Let us give that to the King the Law gives him, and no more."

From the Report of the *Hist. MSS*. *Commission*, House of Commons, June 21, 1628:

"When his Bill was passed Sir Edmund did by the Speaker present his hearty thanks to the House for that favour in passing his Bill. Mr. Alford stood up and said this custom of giving thanks had been omitted ever since the passing of a Bill for the old Lord Burghley, and he held it due to the House, for what have these Lords so deserved of the Commonwealth that we should intermit the public affairs of the State to intend their private Bills."

Mr. Edward Alford died in 1632 at the age of 67. His will is appended:

Edward Alford of Offington, co. Sussex, Exquire, 1632. To be buried in the

chancel of Hamsey Church. "To Elizabeth my daughter my manors of Offington and Hamsey in the co. of Sussex." Lands at Broadwater (the ancient parish of Worthing), Bramber, and Gowing. Tenement in All Hallows, Steining, London. To my son William the rectory of Titherington in the co of Glos', with lands, tenements, and the right of patronage to the vicarage. Lands in Bilston, Cornwall, Launcelott Alford, sonne of Edward. "My dear sister Lady Fettiplace . . . to my sonne John Alford my guilt bason and ewer, and two silver potts with my Armes upon them which wear my father's . . . to Jane Alford my grandchild a dozen guilt spoons . . . to Elizabeth Alford my grandchild my silver bason and ewer My loving wife Judith, and my daughter Elisabeth, executors." P.C.C. 2 Audeley

He was buried in the Chancel of Hamsey Church, near Lewes, co. Sussex, the manor Hamsey being also in his possession, and apparently his residence in later days.

When about 25 years of age he married Judith, daughter of Edmund Downing of Suffolk, esquire, by whom he had six sons:

- i. John Alford, of whom next (4)
- ii. Sir Edward Alford, of whom hereafter (5)
- iii. William Alford, of whom hereafter (6)
- Henry Alford, who became Member for Arundel in 1628.
- v. Robert Alford, who was admitted at Lincoln's Inn, Nov. 20th, 1620.
- vi. Launcelot Alford, of whom no further record is found.

North Carolina Alfords in the IGI

This results in what appear to be duplicates, but there is always a difference somewhere—carefully check the dates, counties, etc. Entries in the original IGI which were the same except for the LDS source (batch or serial sheet) have been eliminated.
