

New Member Lineages

Each of the lineages below was sent to the member for review and comment several months ago. Appropriate changes and corrections were made on those that were returned. Those that were not returned are being published as is and may or may not be correct.

This is essentially the same format as you saw in the last issue. One minor change has been made with respect to the footnotes or endnotes. A number appears at the right of the data in the Footnote column, in this case number 1 or 2. In the notes at the end you will see a comment that tells you those with a 1 were commented on in the previous issue. Those with a 2 are commented on in this issue. In the next issue that note, 2, will refer back to this issue. Space will not permit us to publish each applicable footnote in each issue. We regret the inconvenience of having to refer back to previous issues.

You will also find a date (like 2/94) at the end of the comments about each ancestor. As changes are made and that date changes, the next time the ancestor appears in this lineage section it will be with the updated notes showing the original and revised dates.

Remember, the data used for these lineages is very fluid. If

you have not done so it is suggested you read the article on page 57 in the Winter 1994 issue, especially the second two columns.

The reference between the pedigree number at the left and the ancestor's name is a reference used in our computer system to identify a specific person. No two persons will ever have the same code. If a person marries, a numeric suffix is added to identify the marriage: 01, 02, etc. In some early cases it may be 0A, 0B, etc but these are being revised. If two people with the same name are born in the same state in the same year—which is the basis for the reference—a distinction is made by adding 0A, 0B, 0C, etc. By showing males in upper case and females in lower case, we are able to double the number of codes possible. Dates are normally shown as year, month, and day. Places are shown with the abbreviation of the state and an abbreviation of the county. Burial places may include the name of the town or the cemetery.

We continue to urge you to advise us of the comments that need to be recorded and published pertaining to your ancestor. If you have already submitted that information and it is not shown, then please send us a reminder.

BRI781NC

Conflicting reports on place of marriage. Greene or Pike County. (2/94)

EXU788NC

Exum and Bettie Alford were identified as the parents of H.H. Alford when H.H. married Nannie Wadkins March 27, 1879. Marriage was at H.H. Alford's by B.R. Hinnant, JP. (2/94)

GEO840GA

In the 1860 census of Carroll Co. GA is listed a WASH ALFORD 17 and FRANCES 16, assumed to be this couple. They are living next door to big brother WELBORN ALFORD. (2/94)

HAR898AL02

He is buried in Union No. 3 Baptist Church, Ballplay Community, Hokes Bluff, Etowah County, AL. (11/93 SCT; 2/94)

JAC738VA

Jacob was born December 12, 1737 and christened February 18, 1738. He wrote his will July 4, 1794, but the date of his death is not known. (2/94)

JAM877GA

Birthplace is shown as "Longbranch" Ga. Geographic references indicate there was such a place in both Tattal and Evans Counties. (2/94)

JEP797NC01

Were he and first wife married in Jones Co. or Carroll Co? Much of the data about this family was supplied by

Vachel V. Driver, 740 Stripling Chapel Road, Carrollton GA 30117. He reported that he had a copy of the will of Jephtha Alford but a copy was never received by the compiler. He says that only one son, Richard, stayed in Carroll County. Others moved away.

Franklin Co. NC land records show Jacob Alford who later moved to Georgia and then Louisiana selling land to Jiles Driver. The following is a quote from a V.V. Driver letter of 1988: "The Jiles Driver mentioned in these land transactions was without a doubt my G. G. G. Grandfather. He moved from Franklin Co. NC in 1803 or 1804 to Jones Co. GA and died there in 1825. He left a will in that Co. So we have Jephtha marrying there in 1820. I feel sure these people were neighbors in NC and migrated to the same places. If we can ever determine whether Jacob is his father we will have a breakthrough. Julius is Jacob's father according to these land records. I also notice a "Goodridge" is also a common name in both families. Any guess as to why?" (2/94)

JOH801NC

The birth date is only approximate. It is likely that he died in Alabama. The late Herman W. Alford, AAFA #068, of Philadelphia, MS, did research from which he concluded that John probably lived in or near Carrollton in Carroll County, Georgia and that he is probably buried in Pickens County, Alabama. He apparently also spent some time in Greene County, Alabama. If he was in Carroll County then the possibility that he is a brother of Jephtha Alford born 1797 NC who lived in Carroll County. (2/94)

JOH816NC

Nancy's full name was Nancy Galbreth

Stewart. John was called "Jack." (2/94)

KIN768NC

The following is a transcription taken from LDS Library microfilm 0018914, Franklin Co., NC 1848-1859 Book O, p 153. [Upper case letters added by compiler for emphasis.]

In the name of God Amen. I Kinchen Alford, of the county of Franklin and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, do make and constitute this my last will and testament

1. That my executor or administrator out of the proceeds of my estate pay my burial expenses as well as all of my just debts

2. That my wife Sinny Alford should she survive me have the use during her natural life of our residue of my estate.

3. I bequeath to WILLIAM ALFORD \$232 to bear interest from the 31st Jan 1848.

4. To SIPPY ALFORD the sum of \$232 to bear interest from 31st Jan 1848.

5. To KINCHEN ALFORD the sum of \$232 to bear interest from 31st Jan 1848.

6. To ELIZABETH WILLIAMS, wife of M.D. Williams, the sum of \$232 and ? from the 31st Jan 1848. I loan during her natural life and at her decease I give the same to her children then living.

7. To after the decease of my wife Sinney Alford that my estate left her as foresaid be sold and this amount stated before be paid out of the same and that the residue be equally divided between my lawful heirs with the exception of Burgess Mullins and his heirs.

8. I appoint Bryant Young and SIMON ALFORD my executors to hereby make all and all former wills by me made

Executor under my hand. 15th day of Nov 1848 Kinchen Alford

Codicil to the Foregoing Will

Whereas, I KINCHEN ALFORD, having made my last will of testament, in writing bearing date the 15th day of Nov 1848 I have hereby made sundry _____ bequest according to the then existing circumstance of my estate, but which circumstances having now changed. I do by this my writing, which I hereby declare to be a codicil to my said will to be taken and _____. I direct that the sum of \$220.72 only be paid to each of my sons and daughter (that is to say) William, Sippy, Kinchen, and Elizabeth in full, instead of the sum of \$232 as directed in said part of my will. But that they shall have the interest on this sum of \$232 up to the present date and afterward in this part of my last will and testament of \$220.72 up to the final settlement of the whole to be disposed of by my executors as directed in said part of my will and testament of which this codicil is a part executed in my hands and made this 5th day of Feb 1851.

This Indenture made this Twenty Third of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four between KINCHEN ALFORD of the County of Franklin and State of North Carolina of the one part and SIMON ALFORD his son of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that I the said KINCHEN ALFORD for divers good causes _____ moving me, but more Especially for the natural Love and tender affection that I have to my son SIMON, I the said KINCHEN ALFORD doth hereby give grant Convey and Confirm unto him the said SIMON ALFORD to him and his heirs and assigned forever

one certain tract or parcel of Land Lying in the County and State aforesaid and on the beaver dam branch and bounded as follows beginning at a poplar which is Jones and Thorps Corner & running North to Thorps corner & then running East Thorps Line and then south to Bunns Line containing one hundred acres be the same more or less.

The same to contain be the same more or less together with all the improvements thereunto belonging to enjoy free and clear forever and I the said KINCHEN ALFORD doth hereby warrant and forever defend a good Lawfull Right Title and Interest unto the said land and premisis before mentioned unto him the said SIMON ALFORD to him his heirs and assigns forever against any person or persons whatever holding or claiming any Rights Title or Interest unto the above mentioned land and premises. signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us.

Dear Brother

I have been looking for a letter from you for a considerable time but SIMON ALFORD informs me that, he recd a letter from you some time since and from what you wrote him you must have been under the impression that he was the _____ [apparently an abbreviation for executor] of your fathers will but I can say to you that, I am and that I have settled with all the legatees except you and I can say to you also that at this time SIMON recd your letter that, I was gone to Texas and went prepared to settle with you having got a New York check to the amount of your legacy but, the travel being so great, and being at such a distance from you I did not ____ you as I expected when I left home the nearest point that I was at from your house as I understand was Corsacanno (sic) I left home about the 1st of April and got home the 1st of June. & while upon the subject I can say to you that I do not like your country for various reasons. KINCHEN ALFORD came in last winter and got his part and the parts of the others in Georgia and I supposed that he would have written to you upon the subject as he told me that he wrote you occasionally and as I failed to see you in Texas I can say to you that if you desire me to send you a check for your part write forthwith and I will do so. I have sent several checks to other states with safety. A check can be obtained at from 1/2 to 1 percent discount and can be sold at a premium of about the same which will amount to about the same. Finally your legacy amounts to about \$1060.

As relates to your fathers Estate - I do not think it necessary to into all the particulars but, can say to you that I done as I think my duty to all concerned. I do think that Mr. Alfords will as it turned out did not give Georgia

Children a chance equal with his other children but I have no doubt, but, he though, he done right at, the time for he was a man that did not think of doing wrong But, the principal thing that, operated against his children in general was the gift- of a portion of his land to SIMON independant, of his an equal part, with the others in the balance I talked to SIMON about this thing and told him that he ought not to have that, advantage for the old man was in his dotage at, the time but, he seemed disposed to hold on I sold the whole of the property after the death of your mother. Land Negroes and all the amount, of the estate was eight thousand _____ or four hundred dollars should you wish to know any thing relating to the estate write me and I will give you the information sought. _____ your family is tolerable well at present, we hope these lines will find your family well. Write soon. Farewell dear Brother SIPEY ALFORD .

Dear Brother

I have takin this oportunity answering your letter recd yesterday and and was glad to her from youall. I can sate to you that we ar all well at present. I am overseeing for Kolle that lives in Maderson at the hemss hill place on the road leading from Kinson to Maderson ? miles from Maderson and 4 miles from Buckhed. My wages is all my bread cooking and washing and one hundred dollars worth of meat & 3 hundred dollars. I have 47 hans. Our crops of corn & wheat was very god cotton half crop. Corn is worth 50 ?? pur bushel wheat one doller ????? &

dollars per hundred. I saw Mr. James Pur _____ that lives in 12 miles of Dangerfield he went from Green near Parks Bridge & he told me that filmore ?? was decd he sed he was not quainted with you but promas me that he wal call and see you when he return the sale of our parence tok place in 25 of November. Brother WILLIAM and sister ELIZABETH was thar. I cod knot leave my bisness. WILLIAM bought three Negros & ELIZABETH one tha sold high I think he said for Jim \$12.50 dollars. The estate mounted to 7500 dollars or thar about. I will state to you that my sun WILLIAM was mared the 5 of Janury he marred Jack Mullins daughter. He liv lass year & is get whar I live at Jordans when you was her. I have nothin more I wold be glad to be with you in Texas but I recon that I sall never be able to get thar my family is two large and is getin larger every two years tel it take all that I can make to feed and Cloal them. I have nothin mor give my respick to all you your family & take a part yourself Wright soon and dont let it be so long between times.

See also the many articles that have been written about Lodwick in AAFA ACTION. Use an index as they are too many to mention here. Also watch this section as there will likely be frequent updates to these notes.

There is little by which to determine the date of his birth. The St. Peter's Parish Register proves he had a brother born in 1717 and he, and supposed first wife Elizabeth, had a son, WILLIAM ALFORD, born 1734. The church record also records her death in 1735. There is nothing to prove that she was his first wife or that William was his first child. Most folks take that for granted and many think that Elizabeth was CADE.

Lodwick apparently needed someone

to help care for young WILLIAM and he married Susanna _____ (CADE or HARTLEY ??) soon enough that they had daughter ELIZABETH ALFORD in December 1736. Two years later, in December 1738, they had JACOB ALFORD, and that was the last heard of Susanna.

Sometime in the next few years most of these Alford families left New Kent County and were next found in North Carolina. There has been one suggestion that the family might have spent about ten years in Isle of Wight County, VA, before going to North Carolina, but so far there is nothing to support that.

There is strong, but completely unproven, legend that Lodwick married a REBECCA FERRELL. Until there is some evidence to support this marriage, AAFA is not listing it as probable.

Court records in North Carolina prove that a LODWICK ALFORD there had a wife named Sarah. Lodwick's brother GOODRICH ALFORD, who died in 1753 in North Carolina had a wife named Sarah. Lodwick was the administrator of Goodrich's estate. Some folks think Lodwick probably married his sister-in-law. Some interpret Lodwick's will to include the three children of Goodrich. (2/94)

PAT858NC

Was he buried in Alford cemetery in Franklin Co. or Kittrell Cemetery in Vance Co? (2/94)

RAN870NC

Full name appears to be Ransome Hardy Patric Alford (2/94)

RIC821GA

First name came from V.V. Driver. AAFA marriage list shows that a GEORGE ALFORD married JANE PIPER September 26, 1839 in Troup Co. GA. At least one source shows he

died 1864-65. (2/94)

sar837cd

Sarah was born in Guelph (Eramosa), Ontario, Canada. They resided in Alamo Township 1837-1852 or 3; then Oshtemo Township until her 2nd marriage and then to Texas Township. All in Kalamazoo County, MI. There were descendants throughout Kalamazoo county in 1993.

After the death of William Green, Sarah married Gilson Phillips. There were no children from the second marriage.

William was killed in the Battle of Thompson's Station in Springhill, TN and is buried in Stone's River National Battlefield and Cemetery in Murphresboro, TN. (11/93; rev 2/94)

THO725VA

AAFA member Ruth Moran #622 wrote (caps added): "JOHN ALFORD of Frederick County, VA had a son THOMAS ALFORD b. 1724. According to my calculations this would make THOMAS either 40 or almost 40 when he married Elizabeth. Most of the Alford men married at 18, 19, and 20. WILLIAM ALFORD son of JOHN ALFORD of Wythe County married at age 26—he is the oldest I have found. Do you think that we are missing a generation between JOHN and THOMAS? Perhaps, he is a grandson, not a son."

His will, or a will, in Wythe Co. VA was dated/probated November 14, 1806. (11/93)

THO795GA

AAFA #041 Robbie Alford is still trying to prove Thomas is the father of Hines Berry Alford. Some interpret the 1850 Franklin County, NC census to show Hines in the household of Thomas. (2/94)

WIL799Ne

William entered the War of 1812 from St. Lawrence County, NY. His name was spelled both "Alvord" and "Alverd" on the war record. His father was a Revolutionary War veteran but his name is not known. He married in Guelph Township, Waterloo County, Ontario, Canada.

Martha Ann McCullough was born in Monahagn County, Ireland. They had 14 children born from about 1830 to 1849 whose names were Eliza Jane, George Washington, Robert McCullough, Mary Maria, Abigail Hannah, Sarah Anna, Idena A., William Henry Harrison, Esther Louisa, Martha A., Freelace Maria, Francis G., Helen Caroline, and Joseph Franklin.

1799 is on his tombstone—date of Sept 17 is not verified, nor is 1799 except for the tombstone. Gayle Lynn Griffin AAFA #613: "I have always wondered if he was actually born earlier because his age would have been only 13 when he entered the war of 1812. It would not have been surprising had he understated his age—in 1830 when he married, he listed himself as "29"; and his bride was only 13." (11/93; Rev 02/94)

WIL861AL

He is buried in New Bethel Methodist Church, Hokes Bluff, Etowah Co., AL. His headstone says he was born 1862. Samantha's head stone shows her as "Smythia" born 1859. (11/93 SCT; 2/94)

WIL913LA02

Phyllis was first married to William's brother, Hollis, who was killed in France on Normandy Beach August 2, 1944. (2/94)

The following WIL footnotes pertain to lineages published in the Winter 1994 issue of AAFA ACTION—space limitations prevented them being printed in that issue.

WIL547EN

The father of RICHARD, THOMAS and JOHN ALFORD. They were thought to be the grandsons of Rev. ALEXANDER ALFORD and his wife Agnes. The father would have been one of their four sons: WILLIAM ALFORD, JOHN ALFORD, BARTHOLOMEW ALFORD, or SALAMON ALFORD. Salamon's birth is reported as 1530-45. [See also comments pertaining to THO585EN] (11/93)

WIL775VA

Mary was the daughter of Jacob Miller.

WIL804VA

Elizabeth's date of death is "approximate." She was the daughter of Christian and Mary (Whalen) Penner.

WIL862CA

They were married in Weser City, ID but county cannot be identified. (11/93)

FEEDBACK ON FOOTNOTES

In the Winter 1994 issue of AAFA ACTION, "Footnotes For New Lineages," there was a question raised about the deaths of Needham Alford and his wife Martha (Waddill) Alford of Limestone Co., TX. Some of the descendants of these two have been hunting for their burial plots for quite some time and we have yet to find the cemetery. There was a Horton Hill Cemetery, but it is long abandoned. Noel Alford was buried there in 1915 and was the last burial so far as is known at this time. The cemetery goes way back to the mid 1840s when John D. Smith, the father of Jacob Alford's wife, Sarah Smith, was buried there. It was then called Smith's Point. Later, some of us believe, the name was

changed to the Alford Cemetery because some of the Alford's began to be buried there, including Needham and Martha (so I believe). The Smith homestead northwest of Groesbeck, Texas was sold to the Horton family and thus became the Horton place. It was near Horton Hill (an actual hill). The cemetery name evolved to be called Horton Hill. I found a deed to the cemetery in the Limestone County records last year which called it the "John D. Smith Graveyard," and two of the trustees for the one acre plot were Noel Alford and Jacob Alford. Putting it all together, it seems reasonable that Needham and Martha were buried there. However, we need to find it, which we will. A descendant of Noel Alford in Groesbeck, TX, went to his funeral when she was a girl. She states that there were no tombstones on any graves except those of Noel and his wife. However, that was long ago

and someone else could have put up tombstones. When we find this cemetery, a report will be made to AAFA.

Now concerning those dates of birth and death of Needham and Martha. I have the dates based on the Alford Bible. The Bible belonged to Needham. It is currently in the hands of Willie Alford of Hardin, Texas, per Elizabeth Mohle [AAFA #426] of San Antonio, and is in sad shape. Willie is a descendant of William Turnley Alford. The information from the Bible is on file in the public library in Many, LA, family file number 318. I have a copy of that printed information (from file 318) as well as copies of the actual Bible pages. I am a little surprised that AAFA does not have a copy of this information. The Bible record also shows the birth date of Jacob Alford,

father of Needham, Elizabeth Bryant, and several others and death dates of some. This document really should be in the AAFA files. I will be glad to send copies if you want. Just let me know.

[Bill was requested to send the copies. A number of years ago copies of all "Alford" files in the Sabine Parish Library, Many LA were purchased and are on file. Apparently the Bible data was added later which suggests we need to ask the library to see what other new Alford information they have.]
