 and for which Consideration I the undersigned do by these presents Certify
 that by virtue of an execution issued by an acting Justice of the peace for the County
 of Wake at the Instance of Jeremiah Sperry (fork) duly advertised the rights
 of Gilbert Alford in those two negroes Annas and Pippy and as an acting
 officer for Wake County sold the same at the Court house in the city of
 Raleigh on Monday the 20th day of May Instant, and the above
 named Reuben Mitchell became the last and highest bidder for
 the sum above mentioned. I therefore relinquish to him the said
 Mitchell and his heirs the said Gilbert Alford's right in those two negroes
 Annas and Pippy to them and their heirs for ever in witness where of
 I have to these presents set my hand and seal the date and year
 first above mentioned.
