This is a work in progress and is thought to be incomplete and probably contains some error. This file is placed here primarily as a stepping stone from the earlier generations to the genealogies of the grandchildren of Julius. In most cases the information about the grandchildren (third generation) in this file is identical to the information in the genealogies of the grandchildren. There is one major exception in that information on the children of Job Alford is the work of John A. Rogers, AAFA #0544. John uses a different and more informative style than the usual AAFA format. If the file about the grandchildren carries a revision date then it is later than this file.

His will was written July 14, 1768 and proved in the November 1771 session of the Bute County Court. The will was published in AAFA ACTION, Winter 1994 p. 30. See also www.alfordassociation.org/will.html.

In his will Julius makes his brother Lodwick Alford, and his son James, the executors of his will.

Children are listed as they appear in the will except the females were last. Their birth dates are estimates.

Lucy:

Lucy was enumerated in the 1790 census of Franklin Co. NC at which time her household included 2 males under 16 and 4 females. That would make these males born after 1774. Since Julius died 1771 where did these males come from. Who were these males who are not listed in this family record? Were wrong ages given for the 1790 census? Were there young sons who were not listed in the will?

In her early family group records the late Mrs. Lewis O.(Tressie) Bowman listed Lucy's maiden name as (Newton) but we were advised later that there was no basis for that.

1775, Apr 12: John and his wife were deeded land in Bute Co., NC [deedbook 5, page 285]

John was paid for Revolutionary services in North Carolina (Certificate and Canceled Voucher No. 5230)

Wife Chloe was the daughter of Captain John Pope, Captain of Militia in Granville Co in 1763 (proved by John Pope's will in which he makes his son-in-law, John Alford a legatee and an executor.

"Other sons of John Alford were apparently John Alford, Jr., Jacob Alford, and Thomas Alford, who appear near John and Abraham in the tax lists of Franklin Co. 1798-1820. John Alford, Jr. seems to have moved to Wake Co., N.C. Jacob Alford moved to Greene Co., Ala., and is shown there near his brother, Abraham, in 1830. Thomas Alford seems to have moved to St. Clair Co., Ala., where he was Sheriff in 1840." __Boddie

The will of Lodwick Alford proves that he had a daughter named Mary and a grandson named Bailey Alford.

There is no valid information on the birth, marriage and death date of Mary or Isaac. The will of Julius Alford proves that he had a son Isaac and his birth could range anywhere from 1740 to 1770. Court records prove that an Isaac and Mary Alford, daughter of Lodwick, were married and that they were cousins.

He was taxed for two persons in 1771 Bute Co., NC.

Also in 1771 he inherited from his father ". . . the land and plantation whereon John Ross now lives and in case the said John Ross should pay for the said land according to his bargain, that money so arrived to be for his own use and benefit together with all the stock of hogs and cattle as the said John Ross has now in possession..."

Goodrich Alford received pay for Military Service to North Carolina. Vol VII, p. 96,, Foilio 4, Raleigh Archives.

He is thought to be the Goodrich who moved to Georgia. He was always listed as Goodridge in Georgia.

He was granted land in GA in 1811 and was on the tax list for that year. _JAR

He and his unnamed wife were enumerated in 1820 Jones County at age 45 or over there were no children listed. Any offspring had left home.

He probably returned to North Carolina where he was enumerated in the Franklin Co. 1830 census, and died there.

There is no proof for the children listed.

Jacob died Jul 16 1824, Washington Pa., LA.

Elizabeth: There must have been several other children in this marriage that we do not have. At the time of the 1790 census there were two males under 16 and a female and Jacob. Depending on when Elizabeth Bryant died the female could have been a wife or a daughter.

Frankie: Some folks believe her name was Martha, some Frances, and some include an initial B; marriage place only probable. In 1830 she was enumerated in Washington Parish as Franky B. Allford with three sons, a daughter and one slave. 00102-00100001-01 In 1840 she was enumerated with son Joseph, household also had male under 5. She and her son Joseph were enumerated in Washington Parish in 1850.

"John Alford, eldest son of Julius and Lucy Alford, is shown as a tithable in his father's family in Bute Co., N.C. in 1771, indicating his birth as prior to 1755 (probably about 1750), and seems to have died in Greene Co., Ala. after 1830 (he is apparently the aged man, aged 70-80, shown in the family of his son, Abraham Alford, in Greene Co., Ala. in the Census of 1830). John Alford and Chloe his wife deeded land in Bute Co., N.C. April 12, 1775 (Bute Co., D.B. 5, p. 285), . . . John Alford had at least one son, Abraham Alford, to whom he deeded land in Franklin Co. in 1820 (D.B. 20, p. 75), and to whose children, Fenner, Kelly, Rebecca, Henderson, Hilliard and John H. Alford, John Alford, Sr. acknowledged deeds of gift at the Franklin Co. Court in March, 1821. The last appearance of John and Abraham Alford in Franklin Co., N.C. was in 1826 when Abraham Alford gave a power of attorney to Hardy W. Milberry: She and son Sherrod H. were enumerated together in 1850 Lauderdale Co. MS. She and L. H. [probably should be S. H.] Alford were enumerated together in 1860 Lauderdale Co. MS with daughter Roena & husband Walter Welch.

Riley: Lydia and spouse from Rod Bush who cited a Higginbotham source.

Some of the data came from Tressie Bowman's research notes and family group record.

1820, Franklin Co., NC, the census for Franklin county was lost but Abraham was on the 1820 tax list.

1830, Greene Co., AL, page 392, listed as Abram Alfred: 1040001001-1200001 plus 6 slaves. It is generally thought that the older male is Abraham's father John Alford.

1840, Greene Co., AL. page 134, listed as Olford: 00102001-01110001 plus 15 slaves.

Nov. 19, 1850, Greene Co., AL, Pleasant Ridge Beat, page 273, family & house 457: Abraham 63 NC farmer \$1000, Linny 63 NC, Eleanor 19 AL, and Manerva 16 AL. [Boddie says wife Linny was 62]

In Cox's Store Beat, page 268 family & house 398 there was a Mary Alford 84 VA enumerated with Bethena Pippen a 45 year old female farmer with \$6,600 who was listed as born in GA. Bethena or Bethany Alford is supposed to have married Peleg Pippen so it is probable that the Pippen children listed are theirs. It is interesting to note that there is a Littleberry A. Pippen listed as a child. That suggests there might be some connection to the Littleberry Alford who was born in NC about 1800 and was enumerated not far away in 1850 Mississippi. Also in the family was a Mary Bates 25 GA.

This presence of Behena Alford Pippen born about 1805 in GA and Mary Alford born about 1766 in VA suggest the presence of another senior Alford family in Greene Co other than Abraham. Abraham had an older brother, Jacob, who settled nearby in Lauderdale Co., MS but they don't fit in his family.

Lenor: There are differing views on the surname of Abraham's wife. One view is that she was a Pippen and another that she was a Williams. Beth believes that Linney was the daughter of Rebecca and John Barr Pippen.

One theory is that Linney married (1) a Williams and (2) a Pippen.

Boddie's "Historical Southern Families, Vol XII", p. 62 which says, "His wife was Linny Williams (b. 1788, d. after 1855);" and p. 63 which says, "Linny Williams, wife of Abraham Alford, was the daughter of Simon Williams (b. about 1740 in Bertie Co., NC, as he was of age and head of a family in 1764 in Bertie Co., and d. after 1820 in Franklin Co., N.C.), who served in the Revolution from North Carolina (Box X-100, 2: Canceled Voucher No. 10197; Book X-6-2; all from N. C. Revolutionary Accounts of Raleigh), Simon Williams' wife was named Elizabeth as shown by a deed in 1791 for land in Nash Co. (Nash Co. D.B. 4, p, 70). Simon Williams' will, dated Feb. 20, 1820 and probated in Franklin Co., N.C. (with no date of probate), leaves property to his son Henry, to daughter Sarah Cheves, to son-in-law James Bell and daughter Susannah Bell, his wife and makes his residuary legatees Sarah Cheves, Linney Alford, Lydia Stallings, and Elizabeth Varser; . . ."

There is unproven information that came from The World Family Tree showing Linney as the daughter of John Barr Pippen with a brother Peleg Pippen who married Bethany Alford. We don't know Bethany Alford. Linney is supposed to have had a brother named Alford Pippen.

Some of the data came from an undated typescript "Genealogy of John Rankin Alford Family" by Ursie Alford Uhl, daughter of John Rankin Alford, submitted by Marshall E. Alford, AAFA #0173. Also used as a source was Elizabeth A. Duncan AAFA#0366, "A Glance Back Over Our Shoulders." (self published, no date). Letters written in 1953 by Mrs. William G. (Edith) Cogswell and one written in 1955 whose author is unknown were also source for some of our information.

Baily or Ira were not found in the North Carolina censuses prior to 1830. He may have been living in the household of his father or may have been in one of those counties where the census was lost. 1830 found Baily and son Alsey listed in the Lawrence Co., TN census with the following tabulations. Bailey: 1110101-0011001; Alsey: 30001-00001

One thing I found when at GDAH was a published 1860 Carroll Co. GA census. The Alford extractions were identical to what we had but I thought I should look at who was living around Jeptha and kin that year. Sure enough, two of the daughters mentioned in his will are living immediately next to other Alford kin:

ALFORD SPURNS THREAT

In the Spring of 1832, Needham J. Alford, a Methodist preacher and Sumner Bacon, a Cumberland Presbyterian, held a two-day meeting in Sabine County, near where the town of Milam now stands. Mexican officials had forbidden the meeting and there was other opposition. The preachers were planning to fill their appointment. Just before the hour, a person appeared on the ground declaring he would horsewhip the first preacher who entered the stand. Alford arrived and someone repeated the threat to him. "Well," said he, "I am as able to take a whipping as any man on this ground."

Alford was a muscular, strongly built man, a stranger to fear, who had gone by the name of the "Bulldog Preacher" in Louisiana. The antagonist looked for a moment at the brawny arm of the preacher stretched out at full length over the buck board, and quietly retired. - Martha Wolverton England.

Sources for this record came from bits and pieces from descendants but primarily from a family group record compiled by the late Tressie Bowman which cited the 1850 census, Conerly's History of Pike County, MS 1798-1876 and data from grandson George Watson of Hattiesburg, MS.

E. Russ Williams updated Conerly and published a revised History of Pike County, MS and this record was updated accordingly.

Edwin and his family was enumerated in Pike County, MS in 1850 and 1860. In 1850 he showed birth in Georgia but in 1860 in North Carolina. His father was enumerated in Cumberland Co., NC in 1790.

June 1, 1858 he purchased 38 acres from the federal land office in section 1, township 1S, range 8E.

He and Martha are supposed to be buried on what is, or was, the Eugene Smith farm but to the casual observer they appear to be buried on the highway right-of-way. Applicable dates taken from the gravestones. The book published on Pike Co. Cemeteries calls it the Edwin B. Alford Cemetery which is what will be used in this record.

The published cemetery record says he was born Nov 25 1792 and died May 10 1878 and Martha was born Mar 2 1802 and died Aug 8 1867. AAFA has the dates as shown in this record which are based on actual viewing of the stones by AAFA members.

During the Mexican war he moved army equipment from Fort Jesup to the old Block House on Sabine River. At his death he was survived by two sons W.C. and Rich Mains, and two daughters Madames W.L. In 1850 Washington Parish he was enumerated as John Olford 40 LA with wife M. 35 LA. Children were: Madison 13, Marshall 12 and Jane 11 who were probably those in 1840. Other children were Emily 10, Sarah 9, Seaborn 8, S. (f) 7, Willis 5, Isaac 4 and John 1. He was a farmer with \$1500 property.

In the 1850 agricultural census John Alford was listed with 40 acres improved land and 600 unimproved- \$300 cash value of the farm. His farming implements and machinery were worth \$100. He had 3 horses, 4 working oxen, 30 other cattle, 50 swine with total value of livestock being \$450. He had 250 bushels of Indian corn, 50 bushels of oats, 800 pounds of rice, 3 bales of ginned cotton weighing 400 pounds each, and 100 bushels of sweet potatoes.

June 1, 1858 he purchased 118 acres, section 7, township 1S, range 7E, from the federal land office in Greensburg. On June 6 of that year he purchased 57 acres section 17, township 1S, range 10E and 37 acres section 18, township 1S, range 10E. May 10 1861 he purchased 22 more acres in section 17. December 20, 1884 he purchased 81 acres, from the New Orleans land office, in sections 18 & 19, township 1S, range 10E.

Rolly: I am as stumped as you are as to the identity of Ella Alford Moss. She is clearly different from the one who died in 1945, yet is buried (at least according to cemetery record) next to Rollie Moss who had a wife named Ella Alford Moss that died in 1960. The obit of Rollie D. Moss clearly states that his widow (no children) is Ella Moss of Many. He died because he was struck by lightning while standing on his front porch. His wife was standing beside him but was only knocked from the porch and temporarily stunned.

His funeral home record lists Ella Moss as his spouse but no father or mother. His place of birth was Natchitoches, LA, in 1876. No other pertinent information is given. The funeral home record of Ella Alford Moss also does not list parents but does say her maiden name was ALFORD. Her birth date and age are also not given. Next of kin is listed as L. Alford with a question mark. She was buried at Mt. Carmel Cemetery but with no children and a deceased husband, I'll bet there is no stone. I don't know what to suggest. I haven't checked the marriage records but, like you, checked 1930 census. There was no Rollie/Rolly Moss anywhere in the US which fits. It is important to note with regard to this family, that on the same page of the census in an adjoining house was the family of 25 year old Jackson Weeks, his 23 year old wife Sarah, son James W. 2 months old and a Brinkley Alford, age 6. All of these folks were born in Alabama. Henry and his family were house or family 52 in the census. Jackson Weeks was house or family 53. In house or family 55 was a James W. Weeks 46 born South Carolina, and wife Gadsey Weeks 40. Children were Polly 18, Caroline 15, Joseph 13, Eliza 8, Tabitha 6, Elizabeth 2. All born in Alabama except Tabitha who was born in Texas. Also in the household was Moses Alford age 15 born in Alabama.

Added comments of Wendell Meggs AAFA #506 "In 1855 and 1866 the State of Alabama took a census. The 1855 Census of Coffee Co., AL shows Henry Alford, over 21, with 5 sons under 21. No females. My belief is that before 1860 Henry had put Both Brink & Moses to live with the two Weeks families, and had married Martha, who had two children of her own."

In 1850 Coffee County Alabama there were four Alford households. Three can be accounted for. Turner Alford 49 NC and his family and in the same county, but not nearby sons James Alford and Francis M. Alford. A fourth family, headed by a Mary Alford is not accounted for. Three children ages 10-5 were born in Georgia and one age 3 in Alabama. The family apparently moved to Alabama about 1846 from Georgia. Turner and his family moved between 1847 and December 1850. There is no trace of Mary's family in 1860 Alabama. ***** The 1860 Georgia data remains to be checked. *****

In 1870 Walton County, Florida there was a Henry Alford age 55 (born about 1815) in Georgia with

a wife Martha 50 GA. With them were Brink Alford who was shown as a female age 18. [Is this the same person shown as Brinkley age 6 in 1860 Coffee County, AL? Brinkly was listed as male in 1860.] Also in the family were William Crews 23 and Victoria Crews 22. Was Victoria the same as the Queen A. V., daughter of Henry in 1860 Coffee County, AL?

Added comments from Wendell Meggs, AAFA #506. "I take this Brink to be Henry's son who was with Weeks in 1860 in Coffee County, AL. He was not there in 1866 AL Census."

In 1880 Walton County, Florida there was a Moses Alford, bom about 1845 in Alabama and living with his family was a sister identified as L.V.S. Griffin. According to the LDS-IGI a Levi Griffin married Sylvestia Olford in Santa Rosa County in 1878. Was she the same as the baby daughter of Henry in 1860. 1850 Washington Co FL census, 1860 Coffee Co AL census, 1870 Walton Co FL census. Some information on descendants comes from Ann Faust, 1030 Tanglewood Trail, Woodstock, GA 30188 circa 1983.

- 250. vii **William W. Alford** #10643 b. Abt __ 1850, Alabama. It is possible that he came to the family in the probable second marriage of Henry to Martha. The census of 1860 Coffee County was his only appearance.
- 251. viii **Brinkley Alford** #10641 b. Abt __ 1853, Alabama or Georgia, m. **Jane Alford** #16322. This person is shown as a male in 1860 and female in 1870 - if we have the right person in both cases. A Brink Alford born June 1851 AL was in the 1900 census of Alachua County, FL. It is thought he was the husband of Jane Alford born Mar 1855 in Florida and the father of Beulah Alford born Jan 1872 in FL. This suggests the Jane was the second wife of Brink. In 1910 Brink J. age 52 Florida was with Jane in Santa Rosa County. On the same page of the census was Henry Alford with son named Brink Alford. See also notes under his father.

A nephew was living with the family named William Alford-age 1. He apparently was the son of Silvesta who may have liked "Alford" better than "Griffin."
