Many Alfords were mentioned in the official county records before the first Federal census in 1790. Most of them had to do with land records as witness, owning adjoining, previous owner, etc. Names included Ansel, Drury, Goodrich, Isaac, Isham, Jacob, Jacob Jr., James, John, Julius, Kinchen Lodwick and Lucy
