The entry taker recorded boundaries of the land; if the in three

the tract. Grants were issued twice a year, in April and October.
The grantees had twelve months to register the grant, or it became void.

These grants provided a location for people w o may have lived on the land for as many as 15 years without being able to buy it. The words "including the improvements whereon Arthur Murray did live" may be the only clue the researcher finds for this man's residence in the county while the record office was closed. Nam's for the Phain Carriers were often relatives for the surveying giving researchers another clue."





In 1771 WAKE COUNTY FORMED FROM JOHNSTON, SPLITTING THIS LAND, with the larger part in WAKE COUNTY AND THE SMALLER TRACT IN JOHNSTON CO. The 100 acres seems to have been sold to an EDWARD HOCUTT 1777-1778? Edward Hocutt sold 1789, in which deed, as well as a later transfer, gave the land as "lying north side of Buffalie Creek." Buffelie Creek is west and south of Little River. Also "being part of parcel of land from LODOWICK ALFORD to Edward Hocut."

\*\* The Librarian, Margaret wee, noted on bottom of letter -Johnston Co. Room letterhead which I received 1986: " I found that LODWICK ALFORD got into WAKE CO. when that County was cut from JOHNSTON CO. in 1771.

Would this be the "key" to Senior being in the Assembly and not Junior?

LODWICK ALFORD, Senior, would have had 100 acres of land in WAKE CO. when county lines run, but did he ever reside in the county?
