He was born on December 11, 1916 into the Catonsville, Maryland home of John J. and Estelle Huntley Ekin, the youngest of four sons, Bill attended school in Baltimore, graduating from Boy's Latin High School and going on to Trinity College in Hartford, CT, and then to the University of Georgia at Athens. He returned to Baltimore and began work on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad like his father before him. Married to Mary Boone in 1940, Bill's railroad career took his family from Baltimore to Washington, D.C., Philadelphia and Staten Island, NY. Retiring in 1976, Bill and Mary moved first to Cape Coral and then to Sun City Center, Florida in 1983. In retirement Bill was an avid gardener. He enjoyed growing roses and sharing the beautiful bounty of his garden with neighbors and friends. After Mary's death in 1986, Bill met Louise Alford Parker and they were married in Hawaii in 1988. They made their home in Sun City Center, where they enjoyed gardening, travel, music, reading and ushering at the Tampa Performing Arts Center.
