A Brief History of Her Life

Born Mabel Elsie Lindstrom on February 26, 1917 in Iowa, she was the youngest of 4 children. While serving as a WAVE in WW II, Lindy came to San Diego, where she met Faber Thaanum. They were married during the war and eventually moved to Cardiff where they raised their three sons, Mel, Eric and Joe.

Affectionately known as "Lindy" or "Babe," Lindy was a wife, mother, homemaker, entrepreneur and volunteer. She dedicated her life to serving the Lord by serving her family, her community and her country.

She encouraged others in their endeavors, and never indulged in laziness or self pity. She valued the truth and communication, studied the Bible daily, baked her own bread, and for many years enjoyed cultivating fruit, vegetables and flowers in her garden.

Once, near the end of her life, she was asked what she would choose if she could be anything in the world. Without hesitating, she responded, "a philanthropist!"

And, looking back, no one would deny that she got her wish. Those who have known and been loved by her have received the blessing of knowing a great and humble woman.

She passed from this life and into the presence of her Lord and Savior on January 1, 2008.

She was preceded in death by her husband Faber, her brothers Cedric and Julien, and nephew Eugene. She is survived by her three sons, Mel, Eric and Joe; two grandchildren, Dane and Katrina; great-granddaughters Savannah and Lillian, sister Carol, nieces Amber, Annette, Donna and Holly, and nephews Alan, Jay and Keith.
