

Jacob Alford, age over 45(1820 Census) St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, with 5 sons and 3 daughters, moved from Cumberland County, North Carolina to Pike County, Mississippi and in 1793 to St. Tammany Parish, where he received a land grant in 1809 in Section 4, Township I, Range 10 East, Base Meridian. He married(probably, New Kent County, Virginia, Frankey B. Seaborn (aged 45+(1820 census and age 50/60(1830 Census of Washington Parish, Louisiana. Dates of deaths are unconfirmed.

They had the following children, dates of birth not known in all cases.

1. Sarah(Sally) b. c1791 Montgomery Co.,Ga.? md. c1820 Pike County, Mississippi, Reubin Pierce. They are both buried in Washington Parish, Louisiana.
2. Edwin, b. 25 November 1792, Montgomery County, Georgia, married 20 Dec. 1818, Pike County, Miss., Martha Smith. He died 10 March 1878 Pike County, Mississippi.
3. Jacob, b. c1793/4 md. c1819?
4. Nancy, b. c1794/5 md. 1814?
5. Moses, married 1817 Amite County, Mississippi, Frances Bryant.
6. \*Lucy, b. c1797 d. bf. 1849 Sabine Parish, Louisiana, married c.181? William Maines (greatgrandparents of Lucy Elizabeth(Shull) Stevens)
7. Needham J. b. 12 Jul. 1797 died 19 Sept.1869 Limestone County, Texas, married 15 February 1812 Franklin County, Miss., Martha Waddell.
8. William b. c1800 married Eveline, in Pike County, Mississippi until 1850 then to Copiah County, Mississippi.
9. Warren (nothing is known so far of him or his descendants)
10. Seaborn John,twin, b. 11 Oct. 1807 d. 7 Feb. 1884 married 1) c1832 Mary Catherine Felder, married 2) 8 Dec. 1864 Amite County, Mississippi, Mary S. Kirk Wadsworth, a widow.
11. John Seaborn, twin, b. 11 Oct. 1807 d. 15 Nov. 1891 Washington Parish, Louisiana, buried Mt. Herman, Alford cemetery, in Ward 2. Married c1838 Margaret Brumfield
12. Julius Harmon, b. c1819 died c1869 St. Helena Parish, Louisiana married 30 Dec. 1843 Augusta Addison.
13. Martha, b. c1821 married William Stovall before 1840( living 1850 Census - Marion County, Mississippi aged 29 years)

14. \*Joseph C., b. c1826? Washington Parish, Louisiana.
15. Rebecca, b. c1833??married 20 Jan.1826 St. Helena Parish, Louisiana, Raleigh Hazard. She was aged 20/30 on 1840 Census of East Feliciana Parish, Louisiana.

\* 1850 Census Washington Parish, Louisiana page 453(Reverse) Lists dwelling and family number 228 Joseph Alford aged 34 born Louisiana and female aged 80 born North Carolina, next door family 229 was John (O)lford aged 40 born Louisiana and ages in that family agree with chart of son John Seaborn Alford and wife Margaret Brumfield. Presumably this female aged 80 was their mother Frankey B. (Seaborn) Alford, widow of Jacob Alford.

#### AAFA NOTES:

Further research done since this was published in 1970 proves some of those listed are not correct. This family report seems to be the same as that researched by a person, not known to AAFA, for Mrs. Duncan (Pearl) Alford Murphy to support her application to the Colonial Dames of the XVII Century. The same mistakes made here were also in E. Russ Williams, Jr.'s 1978 addition to "Resource Records of Pike/Walthall Counties Mississippi, 1798-1910, etc. in 1909 by Luke Ward Conerly; which cited the work for Mrs. Murphy as a source.

The Sarah or Sally Alford who married Reubin Pierce was from the branch of the family that descends from Jacob's cousin Jacob who settled in Robeson Co., NC and had families that came to Copiah Co. MS.

If there was a son named Moses Alford we think it was probably not the one in Amite Co., MS.

Julius Harmon Alford comes from another branch of the family. He settled in St. Helena Parish, LA. His father was also named Julius. The Julius, son of Jacob, was born about 1797 in Georgia and he settled in Sabine Parish, LA along with his brother Needham J. and sister Lucy Maines. They were later joined by baby brother Joseph Alford after his mother died.

Rebecca was related to Julius Harmon Alford - not this Jacob's family.
