

Written by daughter Gussie Alford Fortinberry of New Orleans it is interesting how she mentioned so many of the family in such a short letter: Inez, G.K., Roxie, Iddo and Leoda.

In the P.S. it is evident that they were interested in family at that time because Gussie mentions having seen a cousin named Reeves. That would have been first cousin, twice removed, Paul Richardson Reeves, AAFA #0066, son of Haidee Alford & Harry R. Reeves, grandson of Bailey Monroe Alford 1875-1932 and great grandson of Marshall Thomas Alford and Charity Ann Self.
