Dear Wick:

Here is the first item you can take care of as our President. Ambassador Weston Adams recommended we consider engaging James Haynsworth to design and prepare copy-ready work of some type of graphic or emblem for the association.

Recognizing that it is not proper for us to claim some coat of arms for the family or the association, Mr. Haynsworth has a very good proposal. I suggested to Weston that he approach Mr. Haynsworth as to what he would recommend and what it would cost. I think the enclosures speak for themselves.

I yield this completely to you for a determination as to what action to take. You can make the decision on your own, we can refer it also to our other board member, we could refer it to all the other officers when set up, or we could refer it to the membership. Apparently Weston is in favor of it.

Our finances are such that we have the funds at this time. There is about \$1300 in the treasury of which about \$700 was designated for research. We can also inform the membership of the project and its cost in the event any of them would like to contribute.

I recommend that we engage Mr. Haynsworth and that we only submit it to Julius, making a decision of the board of directors. I have kept the originals to make copies to send to Julius if you concur. If you think we should not undertake the project we can tell Weston to let it drop.

I am going to advise Weston I have passed the matter to you and am going ahead and ask him to be our VP even though I don't have Julius' concurrence yet. I can think of any reason he would object.

I'll send you seperately a few pages of our letterhead (I didn't have much printed as I was waiting to include information on our officers) and some envelopes.
