1. **Lucy Elizabeth Shull** b. Sep 27 1919, Texarkana, Bowie County, Texas, m. Jan 23 1942, in Chevy Chase, Montgomery Co.. MD, **Robert Jordan Stevens**, b. Apr 17 1907, Chevy Chase, Montgomery Co.. MD. Lucy died Apr 17 1992, Rockville, Montgomery Co., MD, buried: Rockville Cemetery, Rockville, MD. Lucy was a founding member, #094, ALFORD AMERICAN FAMILY ASSOCIATION. She assisted her mother with Alford research and the "Alford Family Bulletin" She passed on to the AAFA most of the Alford material accumulated by she and her mother. Lucy was the AAFA DAR representative at the time of her death. SSN 439-01-4289.

10. **Williamson Claiborne Maines** b. Feb 24 1817, Pike Co., MS, m. Abt __ 1842, in Sabine Parish, LA, **11. Elizabeth Carter**, b. Nov 15 1822, Mississippi, d. Sep 23 1896, Sabine Parish, LA, buried: Bayou Scie Cemetery, Sabine Parish, LA. Williamson died Jun 25 1904, Sabine Parish, LA, buried: Sabine Parish, LA. Williamson, Elizabeth and six children were enumerated in 1860 Sabine Parish, Louisiana. Enumerated with them as a 12 year old farm laborer was Riley Alford. He was probably Williamson's first cousin, William Riley Alford son of Julius C, Alford and Martha Waddell.

20. **William Maines** b. about 1773, Orange Co., NC, m. **21. Lucy Alford**, b. estimated 1793, North Carolina, d. May 24 1841, Sabine Parish, LA. It is not known if she was a child of the first marriage or the second. One source showed her marriage in 1798 in Pike Co., MS which seems improbable since her father did not move from Georgia to Louisiana until about 1806 or 1807. If she was born before 1790 then she was from the first marriage and the female enumerated with the family in 1790. The fact that she named one son William Seaborn suggests she was a child of Frankie Seaborn. William died Sep 19 1849, Sabine Parish, LA.

"Probably the first settler in the vicinity of Many was William Mains, who settled the plantation now owned by the heirs of Louis and Frances Buvens. Mr. Mains was born in North Carolina and in early life was left an orphan. He was kidnaped by some traders and carried to the North and apprenticed to a carpenter and learned to be an expert woodworker. On reaching manhood he went to Pike County, Mississippi, where he was married, and, in 1830, moved with his family to Louisiana, near the present town of Many. Indians still roamed the woods, and wild animals were numerous. He was compelled to cut his way through a dense cane brake to make a clearing for the house which he constructed. Mr. Mains was the father of seven children, one of whom, Noah, is still living, a resident of Pleasant Hill. William, the oldest son, who shared with his father the trials of pioneer life, was born in 1817 in Pike County, Mississippi, and died June 26, 1904. During the Mexican war he moved army equipment from Fort Jesup to the old Block House on Sabine River. At his death he was survived by two sons W.C. and Rich Mains, and two daughters Madames W.L. (2) about 1792, in Cumberland Co., NC, **43. Frankie Seaborn**, b. Virginia, d. about 1859, Washington Parish, LA. Some folks believe her name was Martha, some Frances, and some include an initial B. In 1830 she was enumerated in Washington Parish as Franky B. Allford with three sons, a daughter and one slave. 00102-00100001-01 In 1840 she was enumerated with son Joseph, household also had male under 5. She and her son Joseph were enumerated in Washington Parish in 1850. Jacob died Jul 16 1824, Washington Parish, LA.

168. **James Alford** b. about 1687, probably New Kent Co., VA, died about 1730, New Kent Co., VA. Birth and death dates are estimates based on other recorded events in New Kent County, VA in the St. Peter's Parish Register. PLEASE NOTE: It is not proven that he was the son of John Alford but there is some circumstantial evidence indicating that he is.
